Minister's Message by Rev. CJ Dunford

Star Stuff & Telling Our Stories

Carl Sagan very famously said: "The cosmos is within us. We are made of star-stuff. We are a way for the universe to know itself", and I find this to be a beautifully poetic, scientific, and Buddhistic expression of our interdependence. This semester, I have had the good fortune to teach a course at the Institute of Buddhist Studies (IBS, a graduate-level Buddhist seminary) called "Issues in Buddhist Ministry". This was a class designed and taught by Rev. Dr. Seigen Yamaoka for the past decade, and it is also based on the work he did for his doctorate of ministry. This course has held a special and challenging place in the hearts of many IBS students over the years, and it is one that threw me off into a wild spiral of trying to understand myself in my first year in seminary.



In "Issues in Buddhist Ministry", each of us delves into troubling and difficult parts of our lives as we struggle to make sense of our pain and suffering in light of the Buddhadharma. The point is both to process our own sense of spiritual formation, and to also take care of one another in the classroom: a safe-space container where we hold our peers without judgment, just with tenderness. I learned, or more accurately remembered, when I first took this class in 2017, that I have been through a lot. I also learned that all those difficult moments of my life were so overwhelming that in order to survive, I had to repress so many emotions and oversimplify just as many relationships, in order to go to school, get through work, try to love other people and learn to love myself for most of my life up until that point. Telling my story with Rev. Yamaoka and my cohort was like unpacking many boxes of unpleasant and unresolved painful moments. Indeed, few people who take this class come out the other end unchanged.

I promised myself that I would do my best to carry on my mentor's legacy and build upon it in my own unique ways when I taught this course. In sharing our stories, we weave and uncover rich and complex tapestries of our lives together in community, and I realized that in telling the stories of our lives and deeply listening to and holding the stories of others, we are embodying interdependence, wisdom, and compassion in ways that we rarely get to do in our everyday lives. At the start of each class, we begin with a grounding exercise to separate this sacred time and space, to open our hearts to our own little sangha. Sometimes I share a song, or lead a piece of Buddhist liturgy, and sometimes the students do that. On the day that I shared my own story with the class in March, this time as the teacher, I realized that sharing all these messy bits of my life have, in many settings, left me vulnerable to judgment and critique: "a minister should have their lives much more together than this person does!" There was a part of me that worried that the class might hold such judgment toward their teacher when seeing how messy my life has been (and still is), so I decided to share a beautiful song performed by Nina Simone: "Stars". In her dramatic performance of vocals and piano accompaniment, Simone starts out the song with a sense of longing and melancholy that builds to a swelling crescendo and anticipation in the closing lines:

I'm trying to tell my story
Janis Ian told it very well
Janis Joplin told it even better
Billie Holiday even told it even better
We always, we always
We always have a story

Music has a special way of reaching into my scattered mind and expressing feelings that are locked deeply away in my heart, and this song, sung by a talented and beautiful Black woman, captures my firm belief that we all have incredibly touching and complex stories to share with one another. If only we will open our eyes and ears to experience the stories of others, then we begin to understand one another just a little bit more. In this way, the separation between "me" and "you" begins to dissolve, and we start to see how deeply interconnected we all are.

I am deeply honored to carry on the legacy of Rev. Dr. Seigen Yamaoka at the IBS, just as I am honored to be able to serve our sangha at the Berkeley Buddhist Temple under the supervision or Rev. Kuwahara. To everyone in our sangha: thank you for all the love, support, and guidance throughout the years. I look forward to the future as we continue to share our stories together.

"Why is this happening?" I wailed. "How can my dear little niece have breast cancer? She was such an adorable little baby! And now that adorable baby has breast cancer! Why? Why?"

"One obvious reason is that she is no longer a baby!" said my protective gandharva somewhat impatiently. "Babies can have health problems, but they don't get breast cancer."

"True, but she's only forty! That's young to have breast cancer!" I replied. "And she has three little kids! She never hurt anybody! How can this be happening?"

"It's happening because suffering is one of the three marks of existence! It's happening because disease is a stubborn feature of samsara! Cancer happens to a lot of people. In fact, it afflicts people by the million. Why are you shocked that your niece happens to be one of them?"

"But why her?"

"Individual cancers, like everything else, occur because of myriad causes and conditions, most of which you mortals will never understand. In your niece's case, environmental pollution and heredity may well have had something to do with it. There's a lot of cancer on both sides of her family, certainly including your side. As you know, you've lost two grandparents, your uncle, and your mother to the disease."

"But they were old! It's supposed to happen to old people!"

"It's more likely to happen to the old, but it happens to people of all ages. Your attachment to this niece, the fact that she's a person you love, not a stranger similarly afflicted, is causing you to argue with the First Noble Truth. Stop this waste of energy and do what you can for your niece. And be grateful that everything modern medicine can do for her is being done and her prognosis is good."





We'd like to introduce our new members, **Rev. Kenneth Tanaka and Mrs. Kimie Tanaka**, and a new college member, **Millie Shukla**. Please give them a warm welcome when you see them at the temple!

Here's a little bit about **Rev. Ken Tanaka Mrs. Kimie Tanaka**:

My relations with BBT go all the way back to 1968 or so when I first visited for a YBA gathering while I was still affiliated with my home temple in Mt. View. Then, after my wife, Kimie, and I began to raise our three "kids" (Aaron, Nathan, and Serena) in the 1980's and the 90's in El Cerrito, they had the privilege of playing on the Sangha basketball teams and attend other temple activities, such as the famous temple camping trip on the Northern coast.

Aaron is now a CEO of a social justice organization in Boston, Nathan is the head of middle school at Prospect Sierra School in El Cerrito, and Serena is a researcher at a pharmaceutical company in San Francisco.

Kimie and I have lived in Tokyo for over 20 years after I took a professorship at Musashino University. I have been retired for 5 years, and Kimie just retired a month ago as Adjunct Professor at 5 colleges. Starting at the end of 2023, we plan to begin spending half the time in Japan and the other half back in El Cerrito, which is one of the reasons for joining BBT. We feel a need for a "spiritual community." We look forward to seeing old friends and meeting new Dharma fellow-travelers at BBT.
